Chronic pain affects 7.8m people of all ages
throughout the UK. Pain has a devastating impact
on the quality of individual lives, their families and
on the economy. 25% of those diagnosed with
chronic pain suffer from depression, go on to lose
their jobs, with few having a realistic opportunity
to return to work. While 'patient-led' health
services are a key priority of the Department of
Health, the need for additional coalition services
for people suffering with chronic pain is essential
to all communities and faiths.

Resources for Children in Church Services

We are blessed in this Parish to have so many young children and families joining us for worship. This can sometimes bring difficulties when trying to accommodate young children in Sunday morning services and we are continually looking at how we can assist those who care for them.

There is provision at both churches in various groups for children aged 0-11, however families with children are also welcome to worship together in church. We would like to extend the children's resources currently available in both St Mary's and St John's, particularly for those under 4 years of age. Both churches do have activity bags, but they have long been due an overhaul. It is important that these new resources help children and families to connect with God and learn more about Him.

New activity sacks will be made for each church based on Bible stories and will contain a story book, a prayer book and an activity.

There will be two different age groups for the sacks: 0-2 years (green sack) and 2-4 years (purple sack). We would like to ask you to consider undertaking one of the following options:

- to fill a sack for a particular story/age group
- to buy a story/prayer book for a sack
- to make an activity for a sack, e.g. knitted figure, hand/finger puppet

There will be a display at both Family Services in July where you will be able to see what the sacks will look like, sign up to fill a sack, buy resources for sacks or commit to make an activity.
